A message from Father Hansen . . . This Sunday we begin our journey in Ordinary Time, and this will be so until Ash Wednesday. I write from my annual silent retreat. Eleven meditations will be preached in these five days.

Thirteen priests are here from the USA and Canada. In a meditation this morning Fr. Paul (who's preaching) mentioned that he often asks children if they pray. Many times they'll say, "with my family." He asks if they pray alone to God. Not usually. One of the goals of Dynamic Parish is, after five years, every parishioner will be praying ten minutes of mental prayer each day. I like this definition of mental prayer (mental prayer, as a phrase, as I understand it, was used first by St. Teresa of Avila): To pray is to talk with God. But about what? About Him, about yourself; joys, sorrows, successes and failures, noble ambitions, daily worries, weaknesses! And acts of thanksgiving and petitions; and love and reparation. In a word, to get to know him and to get to know yourself, to get acquainted! Another goal of Dynamic Parish it that all parishioners will go on retreat. These won't be a five-day retreat but over weekends. One of the seminarians in Cincinnati where I met the founder of Dynamic Parish said he's in the seminary because of the very retreat Dynamic Parish offers. May our young people be encouraged to pray on their own and with their families. After all, one day they'll be on their own and their personal prayer life will be essential to their happiness and fruitfulness in life! I'm grateful to all those on the Dynamic Parish team and I hope to see many of you at the Dynamic Parish follow-up this Wed., Jan. 22, at 6:30PM in Ruggle Hall (repeated Sat., Jan. 25, 9:00 AM).
