“Teach me your ways, O Lord.” (Ps 25:4-5)

Message from Father Hansen . . .

Due to an unforeseen circumstance, I write today’s Bulletin article quite late. I write on Friday, January 22nd, the 48th anniversary of the legalization of abortion in the United States. We are so lucky to have Bill Francis in our parish. I believe his children are 5th or 6th generation students at the Cathedral School. Bill is also the head of the Pro-Life office of the Diocese. I’ve learned a lot from Bill over the years including while traveling with him to Washington, D.C. for the annual Pro-Life March. In fact, this year is only the 3rd year since 1999 that I have not attended the March.

I must confess that I was quite naive as a young man and did not even know abortion existed while I was in pre-medicine and medical school (briefly, until my vocation to the priesthood presented itself to me). Even with all the trips to the Pro-Life March since that time and, after the many hours of praying outside abortion clinics, the most moving experiences as a priest working in Pro-Life work have been as a chaplain for three Rachel Vineyard retreats (<https://www.rachelsvineyard.org/>). I pray we have a chance here in St. Joseph to help many women who have had abortions to find God’s mercy and healing.

In 1999 and early 2000, I prayed most Saturdays outside an abortion clinic in Pittsburgh, PA. One morning while praying, I noticed there were six escorts in yellow vests helping women go into the clinic. One time I said to the gal praying next to me, “look, six escorts, the mark of the beast, 666.” The gal, Jennifer, turned to me and said, “they’re called to be saints, too.” I was taken back . . . but it is true. No one is beyond sanctity. We just need God’s mercy and grace!

This week, Pope Francis wrote to President Biden these words “I pray that your decisions will be guided by a concern for building a society marked by authentic justice and freedom, together with unfailing respect for the rights and dignity of every person, especially the poor, the vulnerable and those who have no voice.”

Let us pray during this year of St. Joseph, that the Holy Father’s words resonate with President Biden (who is also named Joseph) and that the voiceless in the womb are heard! Let us pray that God’s merciful love draws all hurt by abortion to find His peace!
