Message from Father Benjamin Fenlon . . .

So... how are those New Years resolutions going?

I usually don't make any, because time and time again I've come up against the wall of not being able to go through with them, or of just forgetting, within a week or two of the year. And honestly... I don't think I'm the only one that has gone through this.

The reason we have this experience is probably because instead of trusting in God, we are trusting in our own strengths when we make our resolutions. Stoicism, that is, asceticism for oneself and not for God, is growing in popularity these days. It is completely contrary to Christian belief, nearly as much so as hedonism. We are weak, and failing to keep our resolutions just shows us how weak we are! What a rebuttal to anyone who thinks they're someone!

I recently saw a thought-provoking image, in which an atheist mocks a Christian, saying "You need God for everything, and can't do anything for yourself!" The Christian looks back at him, saying "Yes! Finally! Now you're getting it!"

Jesus Christ can overcome in one hour, what you have struggled to overcome over the last ten years. He can restore your family, He can purify your

heart, He can solve any issue that is crushing you. Trust in Him, and you will see miracles – but they will be in His good time, not yours. We've got a long and eventful year ahead of us! Let's offer it all up to our Blessed Lord, and by the time December 2024 rolls around, if we have learnt to truly trust in Him and not in ourselves, we will have already completed (at least) half of the journey to sainthood!


