Father Armentrout's message . . . Happy New Year! One of the important titles or rather descriptions of our Lord is the Alpha and the Omega (C.F. Revelation 22). These two words, as you probably know, are the first and last letters of the Greek Alphabet. In the book of Revelation, the Lamb who is slain, is hailed as the beginning and end of all things. He existed before all else and brought all things into being. An important concept in the Catholic understanding of worship is the acknowledgement that God is the source of all things. Our role in worship is to make a reciprocal gift of all that we have received back to the source of all things! Every single thought, word, or deed can be offered back to God as a pleasing gift to Him. Even time itself can be offered to God. A longstanding custom practiced in many places has been the consecrating of our days, weeks, months, and years to God! Our day can be consecrated or offered back to God with routine prayer such as prayer before meals, morning offerings, the Angelus, Examination of Conscience, and the Rosary. Our Weeks are consecrated by Our Sunday worship, Friday penances, and other devotions. Months can be consecrated by learning what the various Months are devoted to- January, for example, is devoted to the Holy Name of Jesus. In this month we can strive to reverence the Holy Name given to our Lord. And the New Year can be consecrated by entrusting it to the Holy Spirit! We ask the third person of the Most Holy Trinity to be our intimate companion and friend throughout this year. We ask the Spirit for his 7 fold Gifts and the keen awareness of His promptings. Below is a prayer you can recite here at the New Year to gain an indulgence. May our Lord bestow his abundant blessings upon you and your family for the remainder of this Christmas season and throughout this new year! - Fr. Armentrout

Come, Holy Spirit, Creator blest, and in our souls take up Thy rest; come with Thy grace and heavenly aid to fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

O comforter, to Thee we cry, O heavenly gift of God Most High, O fount of life and fire of love, and sweet anointing from above.

Thou in Thy sevenfold gifts are known; Thou, finger of God's hand we own; Thou, promise of the Father, Thou Who dost the tongue with power imbue.

Kindle our sense from above, and make our hearts o'erflow with love; with patience firm and virtue high the weakness of our flesh supply.

Far from us drive the foe we dread, and grant us Thy peace instead; so shall we not, with Thee for guide, turn from the path of life aside.

Oh, may Thy grace on us bestow the Father and the Son to know; and Thee, through endless times confessed, of both the eternal Spirit blest.
