A Message from Father Stephen Hansen

Welcome to Ordinary Time! I write to you from Novato, CA, while on retreat. I promised the ladies in the parish office at the Cathedral that I would finish my article by Thursday morning. What a joy it is to be on this silent retreat with other Diocesan priests (mostly from California), and to send this on Thursday, the day of the week Jesus instituted the priesthood, on Holy Thursday. Of course, in addition to the priesthood, Jesus instituted the Eucharist. Today, in the universal Church, there are a good number of Rites of the Mass. The one we are most familiar with is called the Ordinary Form of the Mass.

On the plane ride to the retreat Fr. Jonathan Davis, our friend in St. Joseph in the south end, explained he learned in the seminary (from Dr. Pinto, who I met this fall while traveling with Fr. Davis in Colorado) that they began saying the Eucharistic Prayer softly in what we now call the Extraordinary Form of the Mass years and years ago. The reason is that they did not want anti Catholics using the words of the Mass to scandalize the Faithful by twisting the words. In fact, he said, that is how we got the phrase popularly used, "hocus pocus". It is a twist on the words from the Mass. We are thankful today that the priest can proudly say the words of the Eucharist Prayer out loud, hopefully with reverence and prayerfully, directed to our Father God! All this is so that the faithful can have full and active participation in the Mass, offering their very selves!

Please pray that more and more people (you and I, too) see the light and beauty of the Mass! And that, with greater confidence and awe, we can unite ourselves - our sacrifices, successes, failures, joy, sorrows, and ambitions - with Jesus as He is offered to the Father, in the mystery of the Liturgy, at every Mass! The representation of the one Sacrifice of Christ himself!
