As a reminder, the general dispensation of our Sunday Mass obligation ended on **June 1**. All Catholics are called to return to in-person Mass and the Eucharist to remain in a state of grace. **Bishop Johnston** has extended a particular dispensation to anyone who continues to be in a vulnerable health situation as well as those who care for them. The Catechism of the Catholic Church also excuses anyone who is ill, caring for a very young infant, or is dispensed by their pastor.

Father Hansen's message . . .

It's good to be home! I write this on Friday morning after Mass. I said to Pius in the sacristy, one week ago today I was heading back to the States (to see my family), and he was heading to Pompeii, near Naples. In Rome I felt at home with the universal Church. In Racine I felt at home with my siblings... but coming back to the parish(es) assigned to me is really home (at least for this life).

Cathedral and St. Mary's have a new vicar (Fr. Armentrout) and new principal for the school (Catherine, Ms. Neumayr). What a joy it is to be called to be a priest, then to work with the family to see the priesthood come alive. You, too, can become more fully alive with new members of the family, assigned or new parishioners, because the local body of Christ has changed.

Last I wrote, I was looking at the Holy House of Loreto where Mary received the archangel Gabriel to announce Jesus' coming (into her womb) and where she and Joseph raised Jesus. Let us see in our family, whether extended beyond our wall or within our walls, as an opportunity to become saints. Let us listen when we're to listen, speak when we're to speak, and always struggle to live in charity.

In family we also extend out generations, not just place. In two weeks, we'll celebrate the first "Day for Grandparents and the Elderly". On April 20th, this year the Holy See made this proclamation: "Sunday 25 July will see the celebration of the First World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The theme chosen by the Holy Father for this World Day is "I am with you always" (cf. Mt 28:20) which is a way of expressing the closeness of the Lord and the Church to every older person, especially in these challenging pandemic times. "I am with you always" is also a promise of closeness and hope that young and old can mutually share. Not only are grandchildren and young people called upon to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer, and of encouraging young people in their faith."


