Message from Father Stephen Hansen...

Today we continue our journey in Ordinary Time, with the 16th Sunday of that Season. Yesterday, July 16th, was the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. You may have noticed that the girl servers wear large brown scapulars (https://www.catholic.com/encyclopedia/scapular) when they serve (the boys wear cassock and surplice). Those brown scapulars are enlarged Our Lady of Mount Carmel scapulars designed by Charles Untz (http://www.myladysknight.org).

The feast was assigned (Catholic.com) to July 16, because on that date in 1251, according to the Carmelite traditions, the scapular was given by the Blessed Virgin to St. Simon Stock; it was first approved by Pope Sixtus V in 1587. Regarding the Scapular, Catholic.com says it "... is the best known, most celebrated, and most widespread of the small scapulars. It is spoken of as "the Scapular", and the "feast of the Scapular" is that of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on July 16. It is probably the oldest scapular and served as the prototype of the others. According to a pious tradition the Blessed Virgin appeared to St. Simon Stock (q.v.) at Cambridge, England, on Sunday, July 16, 1251. In answer to his appeal for help for his oppressed order, she appeared to him with a scapular in her hand and said: "Take, beloved son, this scapular of thy order as a badge of my confraternity and for thee and all Carmelites a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment, will not suffer everlasting fire. ..."

Regarding non-Carmelites who wear the Scapular, Catholic.com says "even though there is here no direct reference to the members of the scapular confraternity, indirectly the promise is extended to all who from devotion to the Mother of God should wear her habit or badge, like true Christians, until death, and be thus as it were affiliated to the Carmelite Order."

Please consider asking Fr. Armentrout or me to install you in the Our Lady of Mount Carmel Scapular if you haven't already been enrolled! All the Frist Communion children have been enrolled/installed in the last four years.
