Pius Nsoh-Awasom's message . . . Dear All,

I missed you dearly while away on the Rome Experience and I am overjoyed to return home to you. The past six weeks have been packed with blessings beyond expectations; but the first of these was the fruit of your charity which provided the funds necessary for the realization of this trip. I must take this time to profoundly thank you.

You may be curious to know how that time was spent. Well, on one hand it was simplistic. We prayed a total of three hours daily, had a silent retreat, had classes, went to a small audience with the Pope, went on pilgrimages to holy sites, the major basilicas, and other churches, visited some offices of the Holy See, and were visited by special guests like Cardinal Pell, Cardinal Burke, and Fr. Jacque Phillipe who lived with us for three days and gave a series of talks on the spiritual life. Each weekend the men were free to travel wherever they wanted in Italy provided they returned in time for prayer Sunday evening. On our getaways, a few friends and I visited Orvieto. A priest who doubted the presence of Christ in the Eucharist had been saying Mass and the host started to bleed. The corporal with the blood stains is kept in Orvieto so we went to see it. On another occasion we visited Assisi to see the monasteries and bodies of St Francis and St. Clare. There I was also pleased to randomly find the Body of Blessed Carlo Acutis while looking for the church with St. Clare's body. I had not known he was buried in Assisi. We also visited Nettuno where St. Maria Goretti's body is and I spent alone time in the house and precise spot where she was stabbed to death. Additionally, we visited Loretto, Manoppello, San Giovanni Rotondo where one of my longtime favourite saints Padre Pio's body is; Monte Cassino for St. Benedict and Scholastica, Florence, and Pompei where Blessed Bartolo Longo's body is, together with countless other churches in Rome itself with the relics of the saints. The Lord had prepared immeasurable graces at each of the foresaid places. I thank Him dearly for them. But He expectantly touched my heart so profoundly on a visit to the prison cell where St. Paul spent his last night awaiting his beheading. Oh, that cold place where one could taste the chills of destitution and human cruelty, so dimly lit, hewed underground with its damp air, wet walls, cold floor, with clear droplets falling from the ceiling like a clock counting down that hour of one's death...there Paul was alone. Such was his life paralleling the Lord's agony in the garden, alone, Sr. Emmanuella, a nun from England living in Italy, led us in a beautiful meditation there. But I was only consoled by Paul himself who said in the reading... "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing," 2 Timothy 4:7-8. This experience and many others like the veneration of a nail and some thorns from the Lord's passion, are

pearls I have stored in the treasury of my heart to be picked up, each at a time, and gently kissed for the rest of my life.

I thank you once more for granting me such a gift. I wish I could thank you enough but know that our dear Lord will reward you with His blessings. I thank Him also for walking with me over the past few months and bringing me ever closer to his Sacred Heart. Not to forget the most beautiful woman ever created, our Blessed Mother...may she always be with you. Thank you.
