Message from Deacon Benjamin Fenlon . . .

A few days ago, I was at a local mall, hurriedly sending an important text as I walked along. Out of the corner of my eye, I saw a lady crossing paths with me to the **right**. She said something like: "Molly, where are you?" – it was a motherly tone of voice. And suddenly *Molly*, hidden in a crevice to my **left** stood upright and screamed BOO! She was about 4 years old. Molly did not think that I was standing between her and mommy. Since I was absorbed in my text message, she really got me! And *I jumped!* Her mom and I laughed about it for a moment, Molly was bewildered, and we went our separate ways.

Recently in my prayers, I have been asking God to give me that candor and simplicity that small children have. Jesus holds them up as the example for us: No passive-aggressive comments, no grudges, boundless energy to embrace everything the world throws at them. That day I was at the mall to see a film called *Sound of Freedom*. It's about child abuse and trafficking. I heartily recommend that you see it: even if you can't stomach to watch it, support them by buying a ticket. However, it is as respectfully made as can be, so rest assured you will not be scandalized, even though the topic is so painful to think about. We live in a world that brutalizes and scorns innocence and simplicity: children are robbed of their innocence by social media, and are forced to face choices and situations that even an adult should never have to face. So, let's make a stand against it. Let's learn from Molly. Let's embrace innocence, trust, simplicity, even to the point of naïveté. Let the inner child free. Be yourself again. Jump scare a priest.—Deacon Fenlon

Message from Seminarian Xavier Schmidt . . .

Greetings! As my time at the Cathedral draws to a close (I leave in two weeks, more or less), I'm reflecting more and more on my experiences this summer. Overall, I'm extremely grateful for the kind welcome I received from so many of you. You've shown me much love and courtesy which I will never be able to repay. Coming to St. Joseph, a much different city than Kansas City, has been both thrilling and eye-opening. It has many of the distinctive marks of a grand downtown: the tall buildings, confusing streets, and hungry beggars, but it boasts its own small-town flair; everyone knows everyone.

One obvious example of this tight-knit-ness is the Catholic Church in St. Joseph. I had the privilege last week of going to four different Catholic parishes in four days and everywhere seeing a familiar face. It woke me up to the astounding reality that we are all part of the Mystical Body of Christ. We are actually united, not just a group of people doing the same things or in the same place; we have the same Head, Jesus Christ.

Last week also reminded me that Our Lord has plans for us that we cannot understand. Deacon Fenlon and I were going on an afternoon excursion after Mass: lunch then grocery shopping. The whole time we were out, delays, extended conversations, and an unplanned visit to the bookstore, caused me to grow increasingly impatient. The day was getting away from me and I was running out of time to do *my* work. But over the course of the afternoon, I ran into three people whom I knew. A Cathedral parishioner, a Cathedral food pantry beneficiary, and a former Northwest University student I met when I would visit the Newman Center there. I would not have encountered any of these people if things had gone according to my planned schedule.

In all of this, there was one question I kept asking: "Jesus, what are you doing?" Indeed, what was Jesus's purpose in having me make brief contact with people whom I barely knew? Did He delay me just so that I could talk to them? What is His plan? Jesus, what are you doing? It's a question we should all ask ourselves when things don't go as planned, or even when they do. I'm still not fully sure what He wanted from me in those three interactions, but I'm still talking to Him about it.

It's not trite to say that Jesus has a plan for all of us. It's not trite, because it's true. In fact, it's one of the truest things we can learn. We ought to ask Jesus several times a day what He is doing. He will tell us so long as we have ears to hear. Please pray for me! - Xavier
