Message from Seminarian Ben Armentrout . . .

Dear Parishioners of the St. Joseph Cathedral,
It is hard to believe, but the summer is nearing an end and before we know it the school year will be starting up again! Jared and I will be returning to Kenrick in St. Louis in a few weeks and the school here will be in full swing. Last week during the Vacation Bible School, one of the topics covered was the Sabbath day. The Sabbath Day was important because it taught the Israelites to trust in the Lord's providence and to keep a day of rest. A few years ago a number of seminarians and I went to a restaurant for dinner. As we were waiting to be called for our table, I overheard a conversation of some college students passing by. "What are we supposed to do all day, sit around in our pajamas and lay in bed?!" There couldn't be a worse misinterpretation of our Lord's command. Keeping the Sabbath Holy is not about being idle and slothful. In fact, this is what led to David's great sin. Instead of making war with other nations, as I suppose kings would want to do in the summertime, he was sitting around idle. This idleness led him to covet what was not his own, and thus he sinned in the eyes of the Lord. There is an idiom-Virtue stands in the middle. On each side of every virtuous action is two vices. On each side of Leisure—which is true rest--stands the vices of idleness (i.e. acedia) and over-activism. As these summer months come to a close perhaps it would be good to consider whether we take any time for leisure? Perhaps we could take a few minutes each day to read a little from our Bible or a spiritual book and ponder whatever may stand out. The whole purpose of leisure is to lead us into communion with our Creator who we are to love with our entire heart, mind, and soul. This is why we come to Church every Sunday, to come and rest with our Lord. It also perfects our communion with our families, friends, and co-workers. It is my hope that every family is able to take a little extra time on Sundays for healthy activities such as family meals, games, conversation, and even prayer. In taking a little time for leisure on Sundays, I hope we will be able to see the dignity of our work throughout the week and come to love our heavenly Father more and more! . . . Ben Armentrout

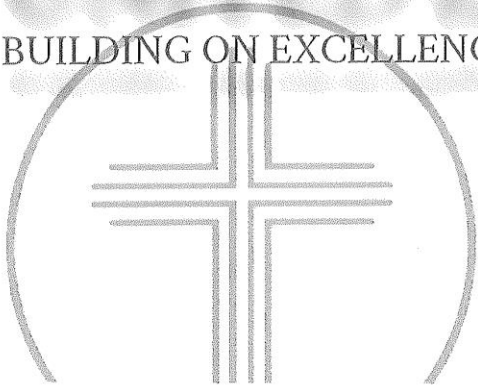

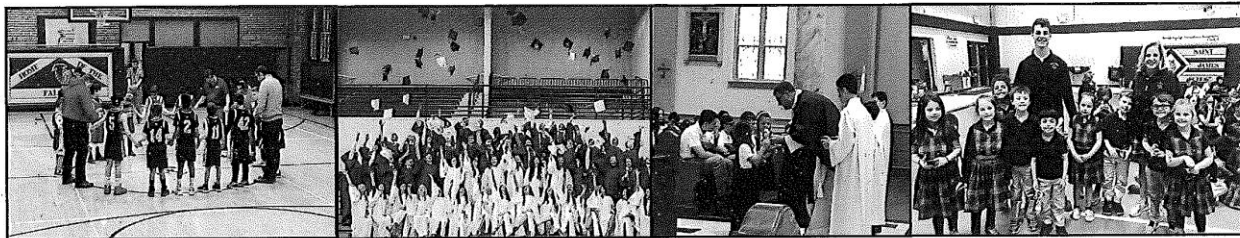
