Message from Father Stephen Hansen

This weekend, I'll be the celebrant at a wedding of two of our parishioners who came to the USA from Ethiopia. A month or so ago, Fr. Armentrout was the celebrant at a wedding for a couple who came here from Micronesia. As a child growing up in Racine, Wisconsin, I pretty much saw diversity as African Americans and European Americans; a lot has changed!

The universality of the Church, it seemed to me growing up, too, was the same, but fewer African Americans. For me, seminary was a place where I started to see things differently. At one point in my small class in St. Louis, we had five countries represented. Two of them were from Africa, and one from Asia. I used to say to one of my friends from Africa, "don't let America corrupt you." He would laugh. I ponder now, why did I say that?

In pondering, to me anyway, one of the gifts the immigrants bring is strong family ties. Not that nonimmigrants don't have family ties, but that immigrants seem to have a heightened awareness of the importance of family. When going to World Youth Day in Spain and Poland, the bonds of the Church family seemed so much tighter. Maybe this was because we needed each other in a foreign country, and certainly the Holy Spirit was showing the beauty of diversity.

As I think of the city of St. Joseph, I can only imagine that St. Joseph if looking down on us, expecting a lot. We now have MOScholars to help immigrants afford Catholic education. We have work for many differing talents and educational backgrounds. And, we have lots of work to do! As we celebrate Independence Day this Tuesday, let us be truly thankful for our independence, but also for the Faith which points out our dependence on God.
