Father Stephen Hansen's Message.. Today we celebrate the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The post Pentecost special Solemnities have concluded, and we return to the sequence which will lead us to Advent, yes, Advent!

Since I last wrote we are all aware of the overturning of the decision by the Supreme Court of Roe v Wade which had said the Constitution guarantees the right to abortion. Some have compared this to Lincoln's abolishing slavery. It's hard to imagine that at one time in our country people of color were only considered 60% human. Today some think the baby in the womb is not human, and has no rights, just as it was declared on March 6, 1857, that Dred Scott - who was fleeing a slave state - didn't have rights either. Thanks be to God slavery was abolished and the Supreme Court has reversed the Roe v Wade decision and gives the States the ability to dialogue about the truth of life!

Bishop Johnston included this in his statement following the Supreme Court decision:

The Catholic Church's opposition to abortion is well-documented and has not wavered. The Catholic Church is also the world's largest provider of resources to mothers, fathers and families facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies, regardless of their faith tradition, through Catholic Charities' Child and Family Services, many smaller organizations and parish commitments across the globe. Anyone affected by abortion in our area will still have the same resources available to them regardless of this change in federal law. We also expect new resources and improved access to them will develop in the coming months.

Let's pray for continued growth of access and availability of resources to assist mothers and children from conception until birth and beyond. I conclude with a personal story. In January of 1999, I went to my first Pro Life March and have missed only three Marches since. In all those years I never, not once, saw pro-life people damaging property or hurting others. How sad to see anger and damage done by those "on the other side." Let's pray that dialogue and love will prevail in the time to come. Maybe, we could seek the prayers of Nellie Gray who founded the March For Life. She died in 2012 and her birthday was also "coincidentally" the day of the of the Supreme Court reversal of Roe v Wade.

Please continue to keep in your prayers the use of the new Educational Savings Accounts (MO Scholars) and https://www.brightfuturesfund.org/moscholars.html. This "game changer" for the State of Missouri and private schools, including the schools in the Diocese of Kansas City – St. Joseph, will have a great impact on availability of a Catholic Education to many in the future. If you know of anyone who is not going to Catholic Schools because of the cost, please have them contact me through the Parish Office or email me at shansen@cathedralsj.org.

Next weekend and the following weekend, we will have children's shoe sizes available at the exits of the church We hope you will be able to purchase a new pair of tennis/athletic shoes so the children in need in our area will be able to have new shoes for school.

- 3) The porch on the South side of the Rectory needs to be removed. For this project we are needing two storm security or exterior doors, an ornate wrought iron hand railing, demolition of the existing structure and landscaping/lawn put back. Anyone who would like to quote, donate, or volunteer toward this project please contact Travis Unzicker or the Parish Office.
- 4) The B&G Committee is looking to create a master plan for the grounds so recent gifts that have been donated can be wisely spent. We have hired an Architect to start these drawings and if anyone would like to donate toward this cost (\$3K) please contact Preston or the Parish Office.


