Message from Father Benjamin Armentrout

Hello from Washington D.C.

This past week was rather eventful. Besides the usual involvement in my current courses, plenty of reading, time spent with classmates and other priests, and another infelicitous event, I was able to witness quite the firework show from the heart of our Nation's Capital! With exception to the diplomatic area of the District of Columbia, the entire city seemed to be putting on individual and communal firework shows. The whole sight, besides making me proud to be an American, reminded me of a line I had read from a book in High School: "Patriotic fervour — which is praiseworthy — leads many men to turn their lives into a service. Do not forget that Christ too has his people chosen for his service." The simple matter of fact is that we were all chosen by Christ to participate in the life of grace in the community of the Church through our Baptisms. We ought to love the Church, striving constantly to live in union with Christ through his Church!

In the Gospel this weekend, we have a reminder of the great Love of our Savior- "Come to me all who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, for I am meek and humble of heart..." (Matthew 11: 28-29). Although I am certain that multiple layers of meaning can be attached to this passage from the gospel, the image that always comes to mind is the yoke of a team of oxen pulling a covered wagon by our patriarchs and matriarchs who settled this country. In the imagery of the yoke, you see the oxen pulling the load together, each sharing the burden and working towards a common goal. In the life of the Church, when we engage in our common goal of sanctifying the world around us- when we work in the service of Christ, we share a yoke with Him who has called us. He lightens our load, directs our labors, and leads us to rest. This is true regardless of one's vocation in the Church. No matter what work we are involved in, so long as we begin all things and end all things in Christ, we can be assured that we are promoting the truth of the Gospel. As we continue these summer months, let us not fail to turn our lives into a service by sharing our yoke with Christ. Let's earnestly strive to live a life rooted in him, grounded in prayer, and oriented towards our heavenly Father.

Know of my continued prayers for you! And I look forward to returning to St. Joseph in a little less than a month.


