The MO Scholars K-12 Scholarships Program provides financial assistance to new families wishing to send their children to Catholic Schools. Families who qualify will be able to apply or a scholarship to attend one of our Catholic Schools in St. Joseph, and donors will be able to receive special tax credits for their donations.

This new law provides state tax credits for contributions to Educational Assistance Organizations (EAOs). Diocese of Kansas city's Bright Futures Fund has been designated as an EAO.

Incoming kindergarteners and first graders, who meet the income threshold or have an Individual Education Plan, are eligible to receive scholarships. Families with children in other grades must have been enrolled in a public or charter school. Current Catholic school families in grades 2-12 are not eligible to participate.

Deacon Joshua Fultz's message.. "...hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." Romans 5:5

It's hard to find much news about hope these days. It seems even Catholic news sources don't seem to have much hope. Instead, we hear about us versus them. Feel free to choose your side. Elephant vs. Donkey, Tradie vs. Novo, Pharisee vs. Sadducee, it's all the same, and it has been from the beginning. From the moment that Adam blamed Eve and Cain killed Abel we have been a people who easily get distracted by a good fight. We focus on the fight, and we lose sight of everything else around us. We forget about the Holy Spirit that was poured into us for a very specific purpose, to "go forth spreading the gospel and baptizing all nations in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." We seek to blame others for the lack of growth in our parishes, for our youth leaving the faith, and for our country losing its moral compass, when in fact we should be looking in the mirror.

How many people have you invited to Mass this week; this month; this past year? How many times did you stop to share the Hope of Jesus Christ with anyone? These are hard questions, even for your deacon. I too have failed at this, and I believe the Holy Spirit decided this week was the week to convict my heart, and hopefully yours as well. We don't have time to waste on things of this world. There are too many broken hearts that need to hear a message of HOPE and many of them are our family and friends. We've turned Mass into a once-a-week obligation, instead of a monumental celebration of salvation. At every Mass we are ripped through time and space and placed before the foot of the cross at the precise moment our Savior dies for our sins. How can we not share this? How can we sit silent? How can we doubt his real presence in the Eucharist? Sadly, we do it easily, and we feel good knowing we are on the right side of the argument.

This week, let us correct our own spiritual compass so that it points where it should, at source of our hope. The hope that will allow us to do all things through the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
