Coming Home to Communion A Frequently Asked Question is: "What's wrong with watching Mass online?"

"Watching and participating in Mass by watching on a computer, tv or mobile device screen is ok in an emergency situation – like, a global pandemic. Now that Bishop Johnston has lifted the general dispensation though, purposely or intentionally skipping Mass without a serious reason (such as illness, bad weather, or the care of infants or loved ones who are ill and cannot be left alone) is a grave sin. Here's why...we Catholics rightfully speak about, and rejoice in, the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist, "Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity" (John 6:52-58). But there is another real presence that is necessary at every celebration of Mass – ours! Our full, conscious, and active participation in the Sacred Liturgy begins with our physical presence at Mass. The Sunday celebration of Mass is also the source of our communion and community life together in all our parishes."

Deacon Joshua Fultz's Message . . . Setting Our Hearts Ablaze

One of my favorite images as an artist has always been the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This image of fiery love calls out to my own heart and makes me ask if my heart burns with the love of Christ. Friday was the solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and Saturday is the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, two hearts that truly burn with a love for all of mankind. So how do we set our hearts ablaze like theirs?

The practice of devotion to the Heart of Jesus has been lived out since Saint John the Apostle placed his head on the breast of Jesus at the Last Supper. Imagine laying your head on the Savior's chest and hearing his heart beating in a calm and soothing rhythm. Listen to how beautiful it sounds as he speaks the words of consecration over the last supper. We too, can share in that every time we are at the Mass. When I kneel during the consecration, you may notice that I drop my head as Father, acting in the person of Christ, speaks those beautiful words. This is where I let my imagination show me the beauty of that divine moment as I envision laying my head on my Savior. You can do that too, and in fact, I encourage all of you to do this. The Mass is a spiritual event that sometimes we have to close the eyes in our heads and open the eyes in our heart to see.

There is also a more concrete way to devote yourself, your family, and even your entire home to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, called enthronement. Enthronement is a spiritual surrender where we allow Jesus to touch us in a way that is life changing by simply placing an image of the Heart of Jesus as the King of Love in your home. This practice will give you graces to deepen your relationship with the Lord. In a vision to Saint Margaret Mary, Jesus shared that:

"Wherever the Image of My Sacred Heart is publicly exposed and honored, I will pour out graces of sanctification and salvation, I will touch unfeeling hearts, I will reunite divided families, I will help them in all their needs."

Now more than ever we need to have the strength and grace to live out our Faith in the home and pass our Faith on to our families in a new way. It takes a little preparation, but this 15-minute ceremony can radically set your heart ablaze and bring new life to your domestic church. As the sanctuary church lamp reminds us of Christ's presence in the tabernacle, the enthroned image of the Sacred Heart reminds us that Jesus is among us and with us. By this covenant we make our homes and hearts His tabernacle.


