Father Hansen’s message



I write this article while looking at the house Mary conceived the savior of the world, Jesus Christ, and the home he was raised in in Nazareth. You might think to yourself, but you were not going to the Holy Land now, but to Italy. Well, the house is now in Loreto, Italy. It has been visited by a good number of Popes and many now canonized Saints! St. Josemaria, whose relic is in the back of the Cathedral in St. Joseph, visited seven times and consecrated the Work God assigned him to, to Our Lady of Loreto.

On May 10th, 1291, just three years before Muslims invaded the Holy Land, Nazareth, the house was moved to Croatia. After mistreatment of pilgrims, it was moved to Italy. After mistreatment again, it was moved again in Italy, to Loreto. Here, where I write, it has been since December 10th, 1294. The house was seen in a vision by Bl. Anne Catherine Emmerich to be carried by seven angels. The house, less the foundation, was literally brought here. Now encased in marble to protect the house it is visited by millions of visitors. A Basilica now wraps around the house. Tomorrow morning at 7:15am Rome time I will offer Mass here (not sure if in the house or at one of the many altars in the Basilica). I will remember all of you.

To contemplate the humanity of Jesus is easy when in a place like this. This small house is where Jesus lived. He slept, worked, ate, was loved, and loved. From this house he walked to work with his dad, to the woodshop. From here he grew up and knew neighbors and relatives. And, through all that Joseph recalled the dreams that guided him to protect the Holy Family. From here, Mary kept “all those things in her heart” that took place from the miraculous conception to Jesus’ death and resurrection.

From our homes (and the rectory) we too live out our human nature. But we are children of God the Father because Mary said yes in this house. Let us commit to saying yes to God’s prompting in prayer, especially at Mass. Let us contemplate the reality that God took on flesh, in a house like ours, and dwelt among us. In the house before me as I write, he dwelt among us!

We hope to be able to develop a well-stocked lending library in the future.

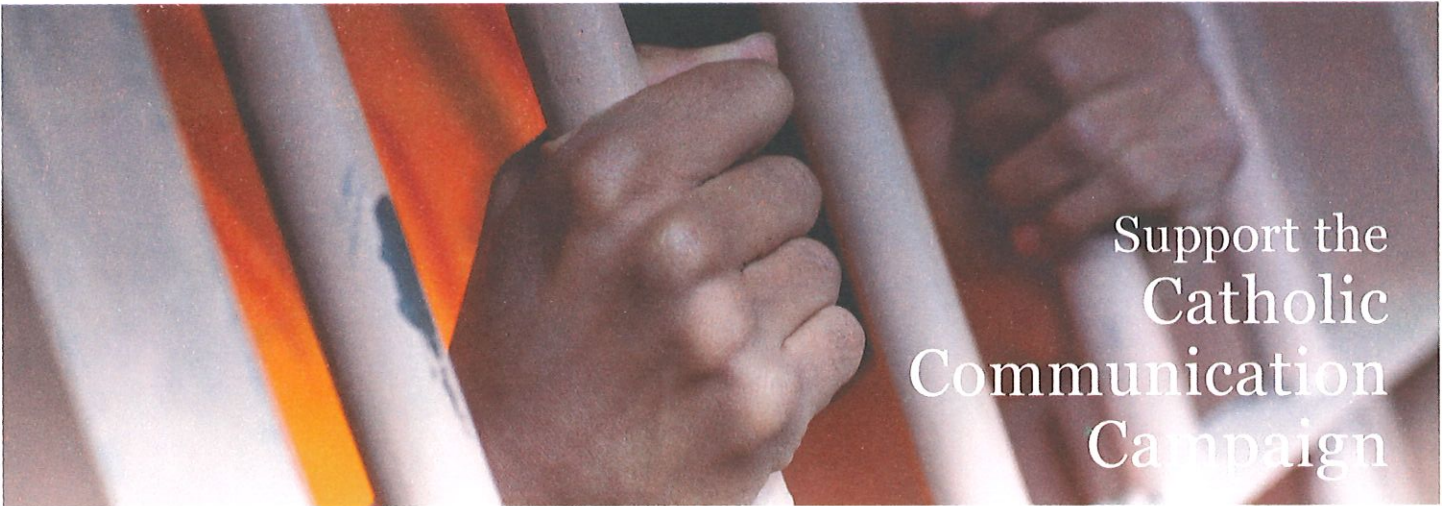

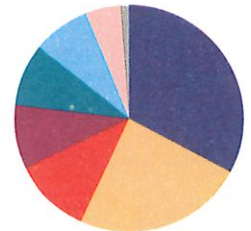
The Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) is an opportunity to bring truth and hope to people across the United States and around the world through the media and effective communication.
