Next Friday, March 25, 9 am - Saturday, March 26, 9 am, our Cathedral will hold 24 hours of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Confession. This event is sponsored by the Diocesan Office of Divine Worship. You may schedule a time for adoration, by signing up online for Adoration at https://signup.com/go/raNYhQe. The only time the Exposition will be "paused", is for Stations of the Cross at noon, Stations at 5:30 pm, and Mass at 6 pm.

Next Friday, March 25, is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. This is an important feast day, so there is no obligation to abstain from meat that day. In other words, you can eat meat next Friday. You may also relax your penance/sacrifices for that one day.

Father Hansen's Message . . .

Today we celebrate the 3rd Sunday of Lent. It was also on this day, March 20th, in 2000, that Charles Anthony Francis Untz died. You can learn more about him at www.myladysknight.org. On Monday I'll go to the Untz's home in Andover, MN, for the memorial Mass. On Wednesday, I'll head to the Holy Land with Religious Ramblers and return on April 1st. Thank you Fr. Armentrout and staff for your extra efforts in my absence.

To think that Charles Untz wanted to be a Saint is amazing. To think we're all called to be saints is another amazing truth to ponder. The Catechism states:

2013 "All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity." All are called to holiness: "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

In order to reach this perfection, the faithful should use the strength dealt out to them by Christ's gift, so that ... doing the will of the Father in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbor. Thus, the holiness of the People of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown in the history of the Church through the lives of so many saints.

I'll be praying for our young people in a special way from the Untz home and for them and all of you in the Holy Land. Please pray for me. Let's continue to pray for peace in Ukraine!
