Synod is "an ancient and venerable word that indicates the path along which the People of God walk together." We are members of one family as the People of God, journeying together under the Holy Spirit, on a Mission. How can we do this better in these times in which we live?

Pope Francis has requested that every diocese in the world complete a summary report which will be forwarded to Rome for its Synod meeting in 2023. As a first step in this process, our Bishop has asked all the parishes to hold a listening/sharing session to provide him with our input, focusing on one theme. Please join us to give your input. Father Armentrout's Message . . . This weekend we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Lent, also called Laetare Sunday, so called from the first words which are (optionally) sung in place of the opening hymn. "Laetare Jerusalem"- "Rejoice O Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast." Other common names, throughout church history for this Sunday include "Mid-Lent," on account of its location in the season and "Mothering Sunday," as the antiphon recalls the motherhood of the Church- the eternal Jerusalem. And more commonly, "Rose Sunday" on account of the permission to break through the sadness of Lenten fasting by wearing the color Rose, the allowance to ornament the church with flowers, and the use of other ritual signs of rejoicing.

The Catholic Encyclopedia* has a nice summary of the purpose of these liturgical symbols. "The contrast between Laetare and the other Sundays of Lent is thus emphasized, and is emblematical of the joys of this life, restrained rejoicing mingled with a certain amount of sadness." This co-mingling of sadness and joy will also be experienced as we honor the passion of our Lord on Good Friday. Then, sadness will seem to overwhelm us as we venerate the wood of the cross. Yet, we will still have a glimmer of joy as we know that our Lord has conquered death once and for all, and the wood of the cross was the means chosen by Him to redeem all of humanity.

As we are reminded of the fact that suffering can be redeemed this weekend and as we progress through the rest of Lent, let us stop a moment to discern the 'fruits' thus far of our Lenten journey. Have we truly honored the purpose of this penitential season so that we might more fully rejoice at the Resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday??? Know of my prayers for you as we continue forward in this Lenten Season.
