"One must not think that a person who is suffering is not praying. He is offering up his sufferings to God, and many a time he is praying much, more truly than one who goes away by himself and meditates his head off, and, if he has squeezed out a few tears, thinks that is prayer." ~ St. Teresa of Avila

We see in this quote from St. Teresa of Avila the great value we can place on suffering. Of course, none of us like to suffer. But in this Valley of Tears, suffering is inevitable. Usually, we need not seek out additional suffering or even ask God to provide more suffering, because every person will inevitably encounter suffering in their simple, everyday life. It is when these sufferings occur that we have an opportunity to grow in holiness. If we offer up our sufferings to God in union with the sufferings Our Lord endured during his Passion, our suffering can become beneficial, even redemptive. We can even offer up our sufferings for a specific intention or person. In this way, suffering can become as salutary as prayer. In fact, as St. Teresa notes, our suffering can become our prayer. Many people accomplish this by praying a Morning Offering that includes the phrase, "I offer all my prayers, works, joys and sufferings..."

As we continue our Lenten journey and prepare to enter into the great Mysteries of Holy Week, let us take every opportunity to offer all of our sufferings, no matter how tiny, to Our Lord. We can then walk every day with him to Calvary.
