### Father Hansen's Message . . .

On this day, March 3<sup>rd</sup> in 1868, the Holy Father, Pope Pius IX created the Diocese of St. Joseph (and a number of other dioceses in the Eastern United States). How much has changed in our city since then. One thing has not, and that is the Cathedral on Cathedral Hill! I know St. Mary's and Our Lady of Guadalupe parishioners also receive the bulletin articles, and hopefully they feel a sense of pride in our city's name, in the fact that the Holy Father saw something special in establishing a see (Diocese) here under St. Joseph's patronage (the second diocese in history named after St. Joseph), and that both the city and the Cathedral are named after the father of Jesus!

This month is dedicated to St. Joseph, with his Feast Day just past the middle of the month on Tuesday the 19th. This year, the St. Joseph Day spaghetti dinner will take place again on the 19th beginning at 4 pm in the Cathedral gym, with the St. Joseph Table of baked goods in the midst of it. This year, Our Lady of Guadalupe parishioners will join us for spaghetti, as St. Mary's parishioners have for years. Let us make this St. Joseph Table and spaghetti dinner the biggest ever. All dinner proceeds will go towards feeding the hungry here in St. Joseph through the Monday, Wednesday, and Friday food pantry currently operating out of the Cathedral Rectory building. Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Mary parishes substantially support the food pantry outreach of the Cathedral.
