This weekend, May 14-15, the second collection will be for the Tomorrow's Priests: Vocation Fund. Bishop Johnston has stated: "This year we had fourteen young men in seminary studies for our Diocese. We will be ordaining one of those men to the priesthood on June 25<sup>th</sup> at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception...By God's Providence, it appears our number of seminarians will increase to around 20 in the coming year...The cost of educating a seminarian is about \$50,000 per year. When you multiply that amount by the number of seminarians, it creates an annual expense of roughly a million dollars in seminary education every year. The Tomorrow's Priest Fund is essential to offsetting this expense. I am grateful for your past generosity with this collection. Any amount you might be able to provide...would be of great help."

Let us also begin now, at Cathedral of St. Joseph and St. Mary's, to ask how can we serve life? Parish based ministries can do a lot with the support of the Diocese and our friends. Let our love for life lead us to assisting others - French or Irish, black, white, or tan... - in need regarding life, in new, - and maybe old with orphanages - ways!

This week I had the chance to attend a priests' meeting with Bishop Johnston and representatives from the Development Office and the Schools' Office of the Diocese (Jeremy Lillig & Dr. Karen Kroh) regarding the new Educational Savings Accounts and https://www.brightfuturesfund.org/moscholars.html. This "game changer" for the State of Missouri and private schools, including the schools in the Diocese of Kansas City – St. Joseph, was unveiled more for the priests in attendance.

The average cost of student tuition in Catholic Schools is \$5,700 per year. The ESA will provide \$6,375 for tuition, fees, and tutors for each child approved. In the first year, we're (the Diocese) guaranteed \$2.5 million in tuition payments for the 2022/23 school year. There will be a letter coming from Bishop Johnston soon, and other outreaches from the Diocese. Please consider signing up at the link above to be communicated with as things continue to develop. It's my understanding that, on July 1st, tax payments can be directed, and Scholars will be funded. All Missourians will have a chance to have up to 50% of their State tax liability go into the fund. Those funds will be distributed 100% to help with ESA tuition assistance through MO Scholars in the Diocese of Kansas City – St. Joseph. Much more information is to come! Pray for the unfolding of this "game changer" in St. Joseph in a special way!

Cathedral's Food Bank usually receives basic food commodities from Second Harvest each month which greatly adds to what can be provided to those needing food assistance. However, Second Harvest is receiving far less commodities than usual, which has greatly reduced what they can pass along to our Pantry. Therefore, if each parishioners would bring one food item to Mass next weekend, this will help our Food Pantry provide assistance to those in need. The Food Pantry still has a large supply of canned vegetables, so would appreciate any other food item. Clean empty containers (such as small size cottage cheese, sour cream, whipped cream topping, etc.) are also needed. Your ongoing generosity is greatly appreciated!


