A Message from Father Stephen Hansen . . . Happy 5th Sunday of Easter!

Today, in Rome, Pope Leo XIV will celebrate the Mass of Inauguration of his Petrine Ministry. As I understand it, it's not an installation, as the moment he accepted the office after the 4th conclave vote he became the Bishop of Rome and the Supreme Pontiff of the Universal Church! We all might get a chance to see some of this very historic moment in Christendom! Who could have imagined an American, born in the United States, would become Pope. Not even the Pope himself.

Lisa Solava (a friend as stated in a Chicago Sun-Times article) sent him (then Cardinal Prevost) an email on April 27 to say she and many other friends were praying for him.

"We can't even begin to imagine what this whirlwind must be like for you right now. ... We all have mixed feelings for you. On one hand, we won't be disappointed if you don't end up walking out on the balcony, purely for selfish reasons of wanting to keep our friends somewhat accessible. But on the other hand, we would be absolutely overjoyed if that turns out to be God's will for you. Your wisdom and compassion would bring so much to the world."

A few hours later, (Cardinal) Prevost responded, saying, in part: "Thanks for the message. I sleep well at night (so far) trusting in the belief that there will not be an American pope."

There's no doubt we'll never see this again in our lifetimes. Let's us pray for Pope Leo, let us pray hard for Pope Leo, that he may lead the Church with joy and peace, integrity and love!

I'm including a quote from the Saint he followed in a special way as an Augustinian that pertains to this Sunday's Gospel: Augustine. (Tr. lxv. 1.) "And now He teaches them how to fit themselves to follow Him: A new commandment I give unto you, that ye love one another. (Levit. 19:18) But does not the old law say, Thou shall love thy neighbor as thyself? Why then does He call it a new commandment? Is it because it strips us of the old man, and puts on us the new? That it renews the hearer, or rather the doer of it? Love does do this; but it is that love which our Lord distinguishes from the carnal affection: As I have loved you, that ye also love one another. Not the love with which men love one another, but that of the children of the Most High God, who would be brethren of His only-begotten Son, and therefore love one another with that love with which He loved them, and would lead them to the fulfilment of their desires."

Two more things:

Mother Stella and Sister Faustina will be here this weekend; they returned to St. Joseph on Friday. Mother's first concern was to have Jesus brought to the Convent. In my absence (I have an afternoon of appointments) Fr. Nguyen will process with Jesus, Mother, and Sister to their Convent chapel. On May 31st, another young lady will begin community life with them and they're having a "Come and See" weekend in June for young ladies interested in being missionaries to the Russian Far East! Nice!!!!!!!! Some have already signed up! Pray for the Sisters!

As I conclude I want to thank our teachers and staff for all they've done to make this school year a blessing to the children and their families. I want to especially thank Fr. Fenlon and Xavier for the dedication to the children and their learning theology. I am proud of them both!!


