Father Armentrout's message . . . Over the course of the past month, I have received numerous questions regarding my upcoming summer in Washington D.C. The most common question has been "what will you do with Canon Law, and by the way, what is Canon Law?" Canon Law is a listing of the Church's laws that promote harmony and justice for the entire Church. [Canon has nothing to do with an antiquated weapon, but rather, the word means 'list']. Since the Church is a society, it needs a list of rules so "that it's hierarchical and organic structure may be visible; that its exercise of the functions divinely entrusted to it, particularly of sacred power and of the administration of the sacraments, is properly ordered; that the relationships of Christ's faithful are reconciled in justice based upon charity, with the rights of each safeguarded and defined; and lastly, that the common initiatives which are undertaken so that Christian life may be ever more perfectly carried out, are supported, strengthened, and promoted by canonical laws."*

In short, I will be studying the universal laws of the Church to help safeguard that which Christ has given to His Bride. Canon Law is ultimately a pastoral listing of legislations that are to ensure the common good of the Church is promoted. It lists the rights of Bishops, priests, laity, organizations, etc. So back to the first question. After completing my licentiate in Canon Law, I will most likely help out with annulment cases in the Chancery (this does not mean I will cease to be a parish priest and restricted solely to office work). Additionally, I would be ready to consult the diocesan Bishop, chancery officials, and other priests in matters of interpreting how the Universal Law of the Church is to be applied in individual cases. I am grateful that the bishop has entrusted me with these further studies. And it will be very nice to be just a short drive away from my sister who lives in the DC area! Thank you for your prayers and support while I am away for the summer. Know of my prayers for you. Feel free to reach out to me via email at barmentrout@cathedralsj.org. This program will take 4 summers with some online coursework in the fall and spring semesters. I look forward to returning to the Cathedral and St. Mary's in August!


