Father Hansen's message...

As the city of St. Joseph begins to open again, our public worship, the Mass, will begin again too. The Diocese has an update as of Thursday; it can be seen here: <https://kcsjatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>

Look for new emails (Cathedral and St. Mary's) and changes to the Cathedral website for Mass times for next weekend (May 9th and 10th), and during the week!!

I write this from the front porch of the Cathedral rectory, on the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. As I look across the parking lot toward the west, I see the Cathedral's St. Gianna ECC. Next week the "punch list" will be made and after the State officials can walk through it will be a fully licensed early childhood center. The first room seen upon entering the Center will be the Atrium. There, children will learn the goodness and love of God through hands on puzzles and exercises in a method called Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

The Liturgy of the Hours for today, that all priests and Religious are required to pray, includes a quote from the Second Vatican Council proper for St. Joseph the Worker. Two of the paragraphs are:

Man, created in God's image, has been commissioned to master the earth and all it contains, and so rule the world in justice and holiness. He is to acknowledge God as the creator of all, and to see himself and the whole universe in relation to God, in order that all things may be subject to man, and God's name be an object of wonder and praise over all the earth.

This commission extends to even the most ordinary activities of everyday life. Where men and women, in the course of gaining a livelihood for themselves and their families, offer appropriate service to society, they can be confident that their personal efforts promote the work of the Creator, confer benefit on their fellowmen, and help to realize God's plan in history.

It is my prayer that children who enter the Center will benefit from the work of their fellowmen. That they learn in the Atrium, but in the Center as a whole, the great dignity of work. The men and women who have played a part in the Center – from Kristen Supple & Jocelyn Winter, the directors during the inquiry and construction phases, to the Knight of Columbus, to John Modlin & Bill Francis, Chris Herner and his employees and subcontractors, and all those that helped in this Phase I of Beacon on the Hill – have been a great example of what we want the children to learn. Without all the generous benefactors, too – from school children with small pledges to those able to make large pledges – none of this would be possible. Thank you all! St. Joseph the Worker, pray our Phase comes to completion with the Bishop's Blessing late this summer or in the fall! St. Gianna and the Blessed Virgin Mary, pray for us, too!

Help *Outpace Poverty*, with **Catholic Charities** during the month of May when they host a (Virtual) 5K Run/Walk that benefits their work in addressing poverty. We will ask our team members to participate individually or if together, maintaining at least the 6 ft. suggested social distance. The funds raised by this event have taken on heightened importance: at-risk families are struggling even more in these anxious and uncertain times. They may have lost wages or even their employment due to restaurant, retail and venue closures. School closures may mean that their children have lost food security as part of their educational day. And an unfortunate number will deal with the actual illness. They are seeing a large increase in requests for assistance.
