Message from Father Hansen . . .

I write on Thursday, the day after my first Town Hall Meeting here at Cathedral of St. Joseph. What a joyful reception we had looking at the healing of our campus and the future use of the building on the corner of 9th and Robidoux; St. Gianna Early Childhood Education & Development Center (St. Gianna EDC). So many parishioners and diocesan representatives have stepped up to work on the details for this project. I remember, like yesterday, receiving a text from a family outside the parish that was willing to help us acquire the property. Mosaic Life Hospital transferred the property to us and gave us only two restrictions: start construction within 5 months and use for the building for an ECC for at least 5 years. This building will allow the EDC children to be safe in a building up to code in all ways (especially fire code). Your gift or pledge (over three years, even) will help us heal the campus and utilize this building; thank you in advance!
