On Friday, May 13th, the National Statue of Our Lady of Fatima will be in our Cathedral from 7:30 am - 6 pm.

The message of Fatima spread throughout the world after World War II largely through the Pilgrim Virgin Statue tours which began in 1947. The purpose of the Pilgrim Virgin Statue tour was and still is to bring the graces of Fatima and Our Lady's message of hope, peace, and salvation to those many millions of people who may never have an opportunity to make a pilgrimage to Fatima itself. Please stop by to pray on Friday.

Father Hansen's message . . .

A few years ago, I was in Racine WI, where I was raised with my siblings and where I will be again on May 21st. During my visit, my middle brother dropped a surprise. He was leaving a career in hotel management to work in a nursing home complex. I think this was partially due to seeing my mom in a nursing home for a short time. He also shared that, after getting a copy of the paperwork regarding my mother's adoption as a baby from an orphanage in Milwaukee, he learned that mom was German and French and not Irish as we always thought.

In 2014, I had the chance to go to Russia and serve, with the Sisters in Jesus the Lord, those in need, including those in nursing homes and infants/children in orphanages. I think back to my own German and French (not Irish) mother and her journey through life. This week the "leak" regarding the work of the Supreme Court led Christians to rejoice at the thought that life in the womb would be protected again by national law in our country. Again, that's welcome news; the truth of life will be protected again. But we still have a lot to do to help women in crises pregnancy, like my mom's biological parents. Catholic Charities in Kansas City—St. Joseph still helps place children for adoption like Catholic Charities in Milwaukee, which eventually took over adoption services from St. Vincent's Orphanage from where my mom was adopted. Additionally, the Sisters in Jesus the Lord's amazing ministry for post abortion healing—Rachel's Vineyard—will be needed all the more to help women for another 75 years. Many, sadly, don't get help after abortions for years. The sooner they get help the better, but we always want to be there for them, sooner or later.

As we move forward hearing about the Supreme Court's decision, let's pray that the truth of life will prevail. Let us also begin now, at Cathedral of St. Joseph and St. Mary's, to ask *how can we serve life?* Parish-based ministries can do a lot with the support of the Diocese and our friends. Let our love for life lead us to assisting others, whether they are French or Irish, black, white, or tan, regarding life, in new (and maybe old with orphanages) ways!
