Message from Mother Stella Whittier, CJD... At the recent diocesan staff day, Bishop Johnston shared a beautiful reflection on "Eucharistic Amazement." This is from my notes:

We get amazed by many things, and amazement always goes with love. There is an element of amazement connected with our vocation — [just think of the wonder of how you met your spouse or religious community!]. There is something in life we can call the "extraordinary ordinary." How blessed we are with what we take for granted.

Let us be amazed at the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist! The evangelists often write "and they were all amazed," about the people who heard or saw what Jesus had said or done, especially in the Gospel of Mark. Let it not be said of us that "And Jesus gave Himself to them, and they were *not* amazed."

We say we are mainly going to Mass to receive the Eucharist, but before receiving, we go to *give!* We are called to offer our whole self—body, blood, soul, and humanity, and receive Jesus' body, blood, soul, and divinity. The Mass is the source and summit of the Christian life. The purpose of the human life is to give God glory, to give myself to God! This is crystallized at every Mass we are present for.

We "offer the Divine Victim to God and offer [our]selves along with it" (Lumen Gentium, II). Active participation is entering in personally, myself, into the Mass. This is the primary way we intercede for the world! In the Mass, we speak for all of creation and return thanks to our Creator. This is how we exercise our common priesthood that we share from baptism. "Through Him, with Him, in Him" we give him glory, praise and thanksgiving.

Let us prepare for Mass, remembering that I am getting ready to bring offerings to God—the people I have encountered, my sufferings, crosses, desires, hopes. This is my active participation, giving myself to God through, with and in Him. This anticipates heaven!

What about when we leave Mass? Be amazed! Stay in love! Let's love Him more! Deepen our wonder in the gift He gives us...Jesus has made it possible for us to encounter Him completely in real time!

The Eucharistic Revival continues—mark your calendars for the "Behold" event May 4 in our diocese and for the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana July 17-21.


