#### A Message from Father Stephen Hansen

As we make our journey through November, and as we anticipate the last Sunday of the liturgical year which will be next weekend, we hear at Mass many references to the last things. Two entries in the Catechism related to this are:

1021 Death puts an end to human life as the time open to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace manifested in Christ. 590 The New Testament speaks of judgment primarily in its aspect of the final encounter with Christ in his second coming, but also repeatedly affirms that each will be rewarded immediately after death in accordance with his works and faith. The parable of the poor man Lazarus and the words of Christ on the cross to the good thief, as well as other New Testament texts, speak of a final destiny of the soul - a destiny which can be different for some and for others. 591

1022 Each man receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a particular judgment that refers his life to Christ: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven-through a purification 592 or immediately, 593 or immediate and everlasting damnation. 594

At the evening of life, we shall be judged on our love. 595

Finally, thinking of the communion of Saints, I came across an article\*+ on an American, Ruth Pakaluk, whose Cause has advanced in Rome, and who is now a Servant of God. She was a wife, mother of seven, pro-life activist, Catholic convert, and Harvard graduate who died of breast cancer in 1998 at 41. When she graduated from high school, she was an atheist. The postulator for her Cause said: "One of the things about Ruth that strikes me in retrospect is that she was kind of low-key. She wasn't assertive in personal dealings. She wasn't showy or aggressive. She wasn't flashy. ... But if she was front and center, like a debate or a speech or something, she was a strong, powerful woman."

May Ruth be an inspiration to us to take our faith seriously. At the same time, joyously, with the knowledge God wants us to be us. In fact, the Second Vatican Council says that "Christ reveals man to himself." Our drawing close to Jesus in this life, in prayer and the Sacraments in a special way, will lead us to live life without fear and to even die without fear!




