Message from Father Duc Nguyen

We are at the end of the Liturgical year, so we have been hearing Apocalyptic Readings about the end times. Today, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King and today's Gospel reading depicts the questioning of Jesus by Pontius Pilate. The divine King hardly looks like a king, as He has now been brutally beaten and bound, and led as a criminal of the worst kind before a human king-like, Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor renowned for his violent repression of any insurrections. Pilate is aware of the charges of the religious leaders, that Jesus has claimed to be the King of the Jews, but his interrogation of Jesus shows that he does not really think Jesus is guilty of anything. In spite of his secular power, Pilate refuses to free Jesus. He tries several times to convince the religious authorities and the crowds that Jesus is innocent, but all have now turned against Him. Although His suffering will be unjust and intense, Jesus retains His compassion for His people, comforting the grieving women accompanying Him to Calvary, forgiving His tormentors, and even forgiving the thief crucified next to Him, promising him eternal salvation. He maintains His Presence and His dignity, a true King to the very end. There is both tragedy and hope in this passage. The tragedy is that sin has blinded the people and caused them to reject their long-awaited Messiah and Savior. The people have been skillfully manipulated by their leaders, who in turn have been skillfully manipulated by the enemy of our souls. Injustice prevails and it seems that death and violence have the last word. The hope of this passage is that Jesus, the King and the divine Son of God, has substituted Himself for sinners, past, present, and future. His sacrifice at the altar of the Roman Cross is the ultimate expression of God's love for sinners. No matter how grievous the sin, release through the sacrifice and forgiveness of Jesus is now possible. His suffering and death have ushered in a new life where there will be no more tears. This is what a King does, cares for His people, no matter what the personal cost may be, simply because a true King loves His people. What a model for all of us, who have been far too accustomed to the violence and brutality of our times, instead of praying for and forgiving those who have harmed us, we take revenge much too often! Lord, remember me when you enter your kingdom. Amen. Fr. Duc Nguyen

Advent With Legion of Mary

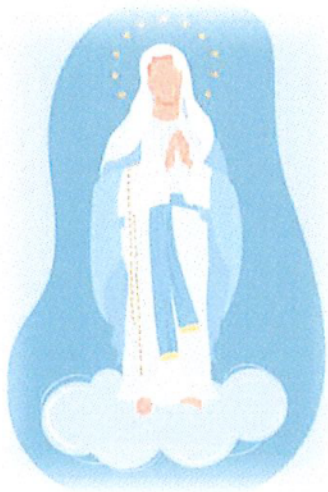
The first gift for everyone is a Bible Study for group or personal use. We will start on this Monday, November 25th, and meet in the Convent of the Sisters of Jesus the Lord following the 8:30 am All School Mass (approximately 9:30 am) at Cathedral. Copies of the study format are available for personal use or groups meeting at other times and days.

The format is a reflective one, keyed to the Gospel reading for the upcoming Sunday. It is based on *Lectio Divino* – Divine Lection (Reading from Scripture). Each session begins with a prayer to the Holy Spirit, and continues with reading the selected Bible text. A brief period of reflection is next, followed by a question to ponder. The study concludes with each person praying for the person to his/her right.

Our second gift is going out to sing Christmas Carols to neighbors around Cathedral and St. Mary Church. Hot chocolate and cookies will be available afterward. Caroling around St. Mary Church will be on December 15th at 3:00 pm. Caroling around Cathedral will be on December 22 at 3:00 pm.
