A Message from Father Stephen Hansen

COME LORD JESUS, COME ...

One of my favorite quotes of Pope St. John Paul II was from an audience he gave to school children in Rome in Advent. This dialogue was in "In Conversation With God":

"How are you preparing for Christmas? By praying, shout back the children. Very good, by praying, the Pope says, but also by going to Confession. You must go to Confession so that you can go to Communion later. Will you do that? In an even louder voice, those thousands of children replied: We will! And St. John Paul II tells them, Yes, you ought to go. Lowering his voice he whispers: The Pope will also go to Confession so as to receive the Child Jesus worthily."

On Pope St. John Paul's first visit to the United States, he focused on confession/penance. At one point he said, "the sign of a healthy parish is the frequence the parishioners go to confession."

There are five precepts of the Catholic Church (Catechism 2040-2043).

The second precept ("You shall confess your sins at least once a year.") ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness. [This footnotes the Code of Canon Law can. 989† After having reached the age of discretion, each member of the faithful is obliged to confess faithfully his or her grave sins at least once a year.]

In my last bulletin article, I mentioned the Cause opened for Ruth Pakaluk. This gal, born in New Jersey, is now a Servant of God. This week I learned about a young man, Daniel Anderl, also from New Jersey, who is being investigated also as a possible Saint. One of his virtues was bringing others back to Confession. Maybe Daniel will help you bring a friend of family member, a coworker, back to this great sacrament.

Another sign of a healthy parish is its care of temporal goods. In fact, just this past week Vatican News had an article stating the "Holy See's 2024 Consolidated Financial Statements" showed a surplus this year, but last year there was a deficit. Of course, each year we put a budget together at both parishes and do our best to keep it. Our business manager informed me, as I stated last weekend at the Cathedral Masses — that at the Cathedral we have four categories that are off budget leaving a deficit after a quarter of a year. If you could make a year-end extra gift, that would be appreciated. I'm so grateful that so many of you make sacrificial gifts week in (or year in) and week out (or year out). Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! This is something for all of us to do, like all the precepts. Quoting the Catechism:

The fifth precept ("You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church") means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability.

We're thankful for the sign of heath as we begin Advent - 17,326 confessions at the end of Christ the King Sunday since August of 2018 – let's all enjoy this sacrament and bring a friend with us! We're thankful for the generosity of so many, many, at both parishes. Let's support the Annual Catholic Appeal, lets reserve our Missouri MO Scholars Tax Credits with a gift to Bright Futures Fund, let's all support our parishes to the best of our ability. Let's all have a great Advent, waiting on the child Jesus who changed everything!
