# Message from Father Benjamin Armentrout: Happy Christ the King Sunday!

Psalm 100 thanks God with these words: "Know that the Lord is God. It is he that made us, and we are his; and we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise."

As Christians we ought to be ever thankful to Jesus Christ our King for the many gifts he bestows upon us. We ought to thank Him for making us, calling us to be His own, and providing for our many needs - both physical and spiritual. A prominent priest in St. Louis, Msgr. Hellrigel, who composed the great Catholic hymn, *To Jesus Christ our Sovereign King*, would give this advice to his parishioners: "Keep one eye on the baptistry and one eye fixed on the tabernacle." His advice was simple: we should constantly give thanks to Jesus our King for the gift of our salvation and a remedy from eternal separation from God, which was freely bestowed upon us by the baptismal washing. Additionally, we should give thanks to God for the gift of himself truly present body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist. We should also bring all that for which we are thankful and spiritually offer these things with the bread and the wine as they are placed on the altar.

As we conclude this liturgical year, I encourage you to pray these psalms this upcoming week as they all focus on this theme of giving thanks to God: Psalms 30, 34, 89, 92, 95, 100, 111. Next week we will begin a new liturgical year with the beginning of Advent. I would encourage you to take a moment in prayer to recall the graces of this past year and thank God for them before beginning this season preparing us for the birth of Christ.


