Message from Father Stephen Hansen . . .

This week I finally was able to visit all the classroom except the St. Gianna Center. Frankly, I first apologized for delaying my visits to the rooms, then I shared I was selfish, and begged for prayers this upcoming week as I would be on retreat.

We spoke in many of the classes about what "retreating" meant. They got it. Pulling back, planning... This retreat will be silent, except for Mass, when going to confession or an appointment with the director or preacher, and for five minute or so at snack time in the evening. The children would ask, "why silent?" I shared, so we can focus on listening to God.

Just as I have described many times, the idea that, when reading a book, a line or two per page may "jump off the page" at us, so too, when listening to the eleven meditations over the five days, certain things will stand out. I'll then pray about those things, trying to listen to God, maybe ask, "why did that poke at me?" Over the course of the week, I'll hopefully draw closer to God and his love, and find myself wanting to make resolutions. How can I be a better Christian, priest, friend...??

In the months and years to come, you'll have a chance to retreat from the world, right here at Cathedral, St. Mary's, and Our Lady of Guadelupe. The first of the local retreats – called "Welcome", which are separate for women and men - will take place in February (Men's) and March (March).

Please pray for me on this week's retreat, and for those making the first "Welcome" retreats in February and March. Please, please, please, continue your time in spiritual reading and mental prayer (even if only three minutes of reading and five minutes of meditation). Also, please pray for Fr. Malewski on leave of absence from Our Lady of Guadalupe, and for the staff there, and for Frs. Armentrout and Nguyen who are helping so diligently.

Our Food Pantry is collecting "gently-worn" coats, jackets, scarves, gloves, or other cold weather items to help keep our community neighbors warm this winter. You may leave the items by the exits of church on the weekends, or in the Parish Office or Food Pantry during the week. Those who receive the winter gear are always very appreciative.
