#### A message from Deacon Joshua Fultz

As we get closer to election day, we have heard a lot about the economy from the candidates, the pundits, and the talking heads on TV and social media. Everyone seems to have an opinion. The only thing I can tell you for a fact is that my dollar doesn't buy as many groceries as it used to. What does that mean? Well, for the poor, it means many more days without food and other necessities. For some, it will mean a winter with no heat; for others, it may mean no longer having a home.

This weekend, we will hear from Bishop Johnston asking us to consider giving to the 2024-2025 Annual Catholic Appeal. For some, it will be no problem, but for others, it may mean giving up something in exchange. It might be a luxury item like our favorite \$7-\$10 cup of coffee, or it might mean eating peanut butter and jelly for the next year. It will be different for each of us. I know what you're thinking. "Oh great, now the deacon is going to start asking us for money." Rest easy; that is not the case. I'm not going to ask you for money, but I am asking you to pay attention to the first reading and pray for prudence and wisdom.

As a deacon, I hear grumblings about the physical condition of our parishes. "When are they going to fix..." or "Why are they spending money on this when they should spend it on that?" Even I am guilty of it. I pray to win the lottery so that maybe I can pay to see both parishes have their ceilings restored. So far, that prayer hasn't worked. Do you know why? Because that is the prayer of the rich young man in today's Gospel. That prayer amounts to "Lord, just give me the money so I don't have to do anything or give up any of my "stuff" for you." That is not what Jesus calls us to do. He calls us to place more value on where we will spend eternity than on living comfortably in our short time here on earth. It doesn't mean we have to give up everything, but it does mean we need to not be attached to it. Everything in this world will wither and decay; it's better to store up treasure in heaven.

I don't want to tell you how to spend your money. That is for each of you to decide, but do it with the words of Jesus in mind: "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."
