This year (2024-2-2025), those who haven't been Confirmed can complete formation in preparation to receive the Sacrament on Nov. 3·2024, March 16, 2025, or Oct. 26, 2025. #### A Message from Xavier Schmidt, our Seminarian Intern . . .

Some of you may not know that many of the young students in the parish will soon receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. In accordance with new diocesan policies, 6<sup>th</sup> grade is the new grade level at which Confirmation will be given in the future. Thus, the Bishop will be Confirming a group of 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders (and perhaps some 9<sup>th</sup> graders) on November 3<sup>rd</sup> of this year. There are two more dates in 2025 for 9<sup>th</sup> graders and those not Confirmed in November.

I, for one, am very excited about this change. The grace of Confirmation I received as a freshman absolutely changed my life. It is the single greatest factor in my own story—what convinced me to stop living as a schmuck and start living as a true disciple of Jesus. I am eager for the Catholics in our diocese to receive this grace much earlier than many of us did.

It has got me thinking though, how many of us actually know what Confirmation is for? The common misconception is that Confirmation is a *sign* of spiritual or physical maturity. But that's not it at all. Confirmation *completes* the graces given at Baptism, including and especially, the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which enable the Christian to grow into a spiritually mature person. It gives *growth* to spiritual maturity, but it does not require spiritual or physical maturity.

In particular, and this is the really cool part, Confirmation helps the Christian to become a better witness of Jesus in the world. This means that our junior high students will receive divine assistance to preach the Gospel, spread the Faith, defend the Church, and show forth the beauty of Catholicism by their lives. Your sons and daughters, grandsons and granddaughters, brothers and sisters in the faith are about to receive this momentous sacrament. Please pray for them in their preparation and afterward—that they may faithfully correspond to all the graces God is giving them for their mission in the world.

And get this: If you're confirmed and in a state of grace, all you need to do is simply call on the Holy Spirit and you'll receive that same spiritual assistance to be a soldier of Christ. Given the current circumstances in Missouri, I'm willing to wager that most, if not all of us, are being called right now to collaborate with the Holy Spirit in defeating Amendment 3. How is He calling you to assist Him? Can you go door-knocking? Can you call Missourians on your contact list? Can you pray more (especially the Rosary)? Can you fast more? Can you, in short, be a better witness to the Gospel, especially in its respect for human life?

The classes meet each Sunday, 9:45-10:45 am, in St. Anne's Room (in the basement of the church, next to Ruggle Hall). Our Seminarian Intern, Xavier Schmidt, and our parishioner, Julie Kammerer, look forward to teaching your children on Sunday mornings!
