Father Armentrout's Message . . Praying with the Psalms

Prayer is an integral part of being a Christian. Our Lord Himself would pray various times throughout the day. Scripture recounts, that he, would withdraw for a while to pray. The day before he called his Apostles and formed the Church, he spent his night in prayer. The Apostles asked our Lord, "Lord, teach us to pray." So, he gave the Apostles the Our Father and formed them in prayer. At the Last Supper, he commanded that the Apostles "Do this in memory of me." On the Cross, he prayed a Psalm - "My God, my God (Psalm 22)." The Acts of the Apostles specifies that the early disciples of Christ would gather at certain times of the day to pray - and many believe they would use the Psalms in accord with the Jewish custom.

Christians have longed viewed the Psalms as a 'handbook of prayers'. In the Psalms, every human sentiment is pictured, from the great sentiment of grief in Psalm 50 to the great kingly prayer in Psalm 2. There are Psalms in anticipation of God's presence (Psalm 6). There are Psalms of Despair (Psalm 22) that can help us in time of grief recognize that God is capable of victory. The Psalms have been called the *Mirror of the Soul* since they capture and express every human experience. I'd encourage you, if you haven't prayed with the Psalms in a while, to pick up a Bible and try it! If you want to learn more about praying with the Psalms, read the book by Anglican scripture scholar NT Wright - *The Case for the Psalms*. Or even, consider making it to Morning or Evening Prayer, which is heavily based on the Psalms, with the Sisters in Jesus the Lord (Saturday & Sunday Morning @ 7:30 at Cathedral, Wednesday @ 5:30 pm at Cathedral [during Lent, the Sisters will pray Wednesday Vespers at St. Mary's before the customary Mass & program]).

In short, if you take nothing else away from this bulletin article, take this...I highly encourage prayer with the Psalms! They can help us relate the most intimate moments of our life in prayer to God!
