Prayer for the Unborn Child - Month 7: We are in the home stretch! I now weigh about 3 pounds and I can use 4 of my senses - seeing, hearing, tasting, and touching. My eyelids can now open and close, and I can look around and respond to light. I also have a grip that is strong enough to support my body weight with one hand. "I call heaven and earth to witness against you today, that I have set before you life and death, the blessing and the curse. So choose life in order that you may live ... " Deut. 30:15-20

Father Armentrout's message . . . Over the last month, Fr. Hansen and I have both given homilies stressing the importance of sacramental marriages. The ordinary way that Christ has willed we are to receive grace is through the sacramental system. An important underlying principle to understanding why Christ would 'will' such a thing is found in an important philosophical principle; everything is received according to the mode of the recipient. In other words, our Lord established the sacramental system so that we might be able to receive his divine grace in a way that best suits our human nature. An important aspect of our humanity is our ability to come to knowledge through the sensible world around us. When Jesus - the Word of God - became a man, he revealed to us more perfectly his divinity. Instead of speaking through his prophets, he becomes a man so that we might better understand who God is. After his Ascension into heaven, it is rather fitting that our Lord would leave his Church a visible and tangible sign of his presence. The Eucharist and Baptism are naturally the Sacraments we speak about most frequently in the Catholic Church. Marriage is the ordinary way that our Lord would wish to bestow upon a couple his grace allowing them to elevate what is a natural union to be an eternal sign of our Lord's love of humanity by death on the Cross, Pius XII articulates the central components of this union well in the Encyclical letter Casti Connubii: Yet although matrimony is of its very nature of divine institution, the human will, too, enters into it and performs a most noble part. For each individual marriage, inasmuch as it is a conjugal union of a particular man and woman, arises only from the free consent of each of the spouses; and this free act of the will, by which each party hands over and accepts those rights proper to the state of marriage, is so necessary to constitute true marriage that it cannot be supplied by any human power. This freedom, however, regards only the question whether the contracting parties really wish to enter upon matrimony or to marry this particular person; but the nature of matrimony is entirely independent of the free will of man, so that if one has once contracted matrimony, he is thereby subject to its divinely made laws and its essential properties. For the Angelic Doctor, writing on conjugal honor and on the offspring, which is the fruit of marriage, says: "These things are so contained in matrimony by the marriage pact itself that, if anything to the contrary were expressed in the consent which makes the marriage, it would not be a true marriage." By matrimony, therefore, the souls of the contracting parties are joined and knit together more directly and more intimately than are their bodies, and that not by any passing affection of sense of spirit, but by a deliberate and firm act of the will; and from this union of souls by God's decree, a sacred and inviolable bond arises. Hence the nature of this contract, which is proper and peculiar to it alone, makes it entirely different both from the union of animals entered into by the blind instinct of nature alone in which neither reason nor free will plays a part, and also from the haphazard unions of men, which are far removed from all true and honorable unions of will and enjoy none of the rights of family life.

In marriage then, the couple becomes a visible sign of the love of Christ and of his bride the Church. The couple, through this beautiful union, are actually configured more closely to Jesus Christ in his sacrificial gift of self to his beloved! There is so much more that could be said regarding this great sacrament. But I think it is extremely important to recognize that even marriage itself, the first building block of society, is meant to be a sign that points to the coming of Christ's Kingdom. It is a sign that orients us to our Eternal goal.
