Message from Father Stephen Hansen . . . Archangels and Guardian Angels

I wrote this article on Friday, September 29th. Today is the Feast of the Archangels, tomorrow is the Memorial of St. Jerome, if October 1st weren't a Sunday, it would be the Memorial of St. Therese, and Monday will be the Memorial of the Guardian Angels.

In years past each of the Archangels (Michael, Raphel, and Gabriel) each had their own Feast, but in 1969 they were combined and are now celebrated together on September 29th. St. Gregory wrote a classic (spans time) piece on the Archangels. Here are some excerpts:

You should be aware that the word "angel" denotes a function rather than a nature. Those holy spirits of heaven have indeed always been spirits. They can only be called angels when they deliver some message. Moreover, those who deliver messages of lesser importance are called angels; and those who proclaim messages of supreme importance are called archangels.

Michael means "Who is like God"; Gabriel is "The Strength of God"; and Raphael is "God's Remedy." ...

Whenever some act of wondrous power must be performed, Michael is sent, so that his action and his name may make it clear that no one can do what God does by his superior power. ... So too Gabriel, who is called God's strength, was sent to Mary. He came to announce the One who appeared as a humble man to quell the cosmic power. ... Raphael means, as I have said, God's remedy, for when he touched Tobit's eyes in order to cure him, he banished the darkness of his blindness. ..."

On the Memorial of St. Jerome, we can contemplate the importance of Scripture. St. Paul tells us in 2 Tim, 3:16 that "...scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." St. Jerome says: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ!"

St. Therese, doctor of the Church, tells us: "The good God does not need years to accomplish His work of love in a soul; one ray from His Heart can, in an instant, make His flower bloom for eternity."

Let's go to the Archangels in time of need, let's read our New Testaments (Bibles) 1-5 minutes, 7 days a week, let's trust in God's goodness, and let's count on and pray to our Guardian Angels each day:

Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen!
