Deacon Joshua Fultz's message . . . *"O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!" - Ps 106*

I remember it was spring of 1980-something when I was gifted with my very own pocketknife. I was in cub scouts, and we were working on our various badges and learning the rules of being a scout. One of those rules was that when we handed a knife to anyone, we had to wait for the person to say thank you before we let go of it. The rule is meant to teach us a lesson about safety and paying attention when handling dangerous tools or objects, but I think it taught me a little more.

If ever there is one thing lacking in our culture today, it's genuine gratitude. It's easy to say thank you after someone does something for us. Hopefully, it's an automatic response for most of us. I can't count the number of times my grandfather drilled me with the question "did you say thank you!?" or worse yet "do you know how to say thank you!?"

That last question is the one I think all of us should be asking ourselves more often. It's easy to blankly say the words, but what if we began to treat every thank you like a cub scout? Think about how much we could impact not only the lives of the people we are thanking, but even our own lives just by being thoughtful in how we say it. What if we don't let go of our "thank you" until we fully say what we are thankful for?

This week we hear about Naaman who was so thankful that God used Elisha to heal him, that he took the dirt from the ground where he was standing because he knew it was holy ground. We also hear in the gospel of the one leper who came back and fell at Jesus' feet giving him thanks for being healed. I'm sure those other nine were thankful that they were healed, but in essence they just said "thanks" and moved on.

This week I want to challenge everyone who reads this article to make sure that every "thank you" that come across your lips is an intentional one. Be a good cub scout. Look the person in the eye and shake their hand and let them know why you're thankful.

Our **Food Pantry** is in constant need of your donations, whether it be non-perishable food items (canned goods, pasta/noodles, cereal, etc.) or paper/plastic grocery bags, empty food containers and water bottles - every contribution is put to good use. During the month of **September**, our pantry served **475 households** including **879 adults** and **558 children** in the 12 days we were open (3 days a week, 1.5 hours per day). **Thank you** for your continued support of our pantry serving those in need.

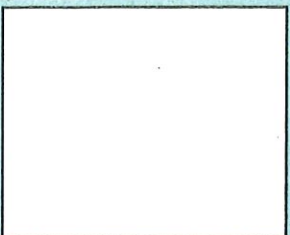

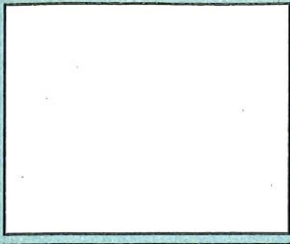
