A reflection from Father Hansen...

Today would be the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, if the date did not fall on a Sunday. I'm behind in m visits to the classrooms but I had the chance to visit the 4th graders this week. My assignment for them as a class was to share with me what the seven sorrows of Mary were on my next visit. Here they are:

- The Prophecy of Simeon over the Infant Jesus (Luke 2:34)
- The Flight into Egypt of the Holy Family (Matthew 2:13)
- The Loss of the Child Jesus for Three Days (Luke 2:43)
- The Meeting of Jesus and Mary along the Way of the Cross (Luke 23:26)
- The Crucifixion, where Mary stands at the foot of the cross (John 19:25)
- The Descent from the Cross, where Mary receives the dead body of Jesus in her arms (Matthew 27:57)
- The Burial of Jesus (John 19:40)

It's hard to imagine the sentiments of Mary's heart when she went with Joseph and baby Jesus in flight to Egypt. Imagine the sentiments of her heart meeting Jesus on the way of the cross and at the crucifixion. Let us, too though, imagine the sentiments of her heart after the resurrection and the promises made by her son and Lord! Mary will help us make joys out of our sufferings by aligning our hearts through hers to her son's! Let us be faithful to the portion of the Rosary we've committed to, even if one decade. Over time let us build until we're each five decades a day. With the prayer of the Rosary our sorrows will be turned into joys!

Four years ago today Bishop Johnston was appointed the 7th Bishop of the Diocese of Kansas City – St. Joseph. Let us all remember him in our Rosary's today!

Catholic Charities of Kansas City-St. Joseph was recently awarded a \$6.2 million low-income housing tax credit project from the Missouri Housing Development Commission (MHDC) to build permanent housing units for low-income seniors in St. Joseph, MO. Saint Charles Place units are open for seniors at or below 30-60% area median income. Most of the units are two bedrooms and will be single story, ground-level entry buildings. Rent ranges from \$185.00 to \$550.00, depending on income. The building will take from 9-12 months to complete and as they get closer to completion, they will announce information regarding how to apply for a unit.
