A reflection from Father Hansen...

Last year in his message on the World Day of Prayer for Care for Creation, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, said: "For us Christians, water represents an essential element of purification and of life. We think immediately of baptism, the sacrament of our rebirth. Water made holy by the Spirit is the matter by which God has given us life and renewed us; it is the blessed source of undying life. For Christians of different confessions, baptism also represents the real and irreplaceable point of departure for experiencing an ever more authentic fraternity on the way to full unity. Jesus, in the course of his mission, promised a water capable of quenching human thirst for ever (cf. Jn 4:14). He prophesied, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink (Jn 7:37). To drink from Jesus means to encounter him personally as the Lord, drawing from his words the meaning of life. May the words he spoke from the cross - "I thirst" (Jn 19:28) - echo constantly in our hearts."

The thirst we have for Jesus is a true gift. In some ways this mystery is central to each of our hearts. This past week in Italy they celebrated "National Liturgical Week." The Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, wrote: "The theme of holiness immediately and directly invokes the liturgy," referring to "Sacrosanctum Concilium", the Council's constitution on the sacred liturgy. The Council Fathers "insist on the fact that the liturgy, at the moment in which it celebrates holiness, sanctifies those who participate in it" - something with which Pope Francis agrees when he says, "the liturgy is the life for the entire people of the Church". May the thirst we have for Jesus be fortified in the coming years and may the sanctifying action of Eucharist and our participation in it draw many others here in St. Joseph to Christ's real and substantial presence there!
