Father Hansen's message . . .

I write you again from my workshop. By the time you get this, Sunday, September 12th, I'll be on a safari. From what I understand early Saturday we'll drive four or so hours outside Nairobi and get a survey of the land of Mara. On Sunday we have a full day of seeing animals, the land, and friendship. Monday after some final surveying we'll had back to Nairobi.

As I sat to write this on Monday, September 6th, one of the priests, in this case a Bishop, Dominic, said, "Oh you want to sit down here and read with our mother Mary?" As I write, in front of me is a tiled image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To my right is the Indian Ocean with its roar of the waves hitting reef maybe a quarter mile out.

I'd like to write about two things: spiritual reading and Marian devotion. In a book called "The Way" by Saint Josemaria Escriva (who really is the inspiration for this Workshop), we read "Don't neglect your spiritual reading. — Reading has made many saints." Spiritual reading of Sacred Scripture and a spiritual book has changed my life, and many others. I customarily set a timer sometime during the day (often in the confessional and often as well in the church) for 15 minutes and simply pray to the Holy Spirit, then read the New Testament for about 5 minutes and a spiritual book for the remainder of the 15 minutes. I'm not sure where you are in spiritual reading but as I wrote last week, starting with 2-5 minutes (that's where I started) per day will make a big impact. Often (usually) I underline or make notes in the margin when I'm reading (specially the spiritual books). These underlined parts will make for good mental prayer (a topic in another article). A stop at Blessing of St. Joseph will get you a good book if you're looking for one... and hesitate not to ask Fr. Armentrout or me for a suggested title.

Marian devotion is another key part of a plan of life, norms in an ordinary life of prayer. Often, I'll suggest a place to start which may be a decade of the Rosary a day. You might prefer starting with the Angelus prayer at noon, or maybe a Marian hymn you like at another time during the day. Once you have the habit of one decade of the Rosary (maybe tied to something you already do like dinner, ride to or from work or school, after dishes...) is very easy to add a second decade. One of the favorite customs I like to promote is the family Rosary. We do that as a parish on Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday evenings at 7pm (on Facebook Live). Many prefer doing it after dinner in their living rooms. Call a friend of yours if you live alone and pray it together. I highly recommend not "making" the children pray; let them come, they will!

When you pray your Rosary, please remember to pray for me and Fr. Armentrout. We need those requests of yours before Our Lady and the face of God! See you soon!!!
