When I was in Pre-Theology, just before Major Seminary, I learned that Pope St. John XXIII had the habit of praying for the Guardian Angels of others (like before calling them on the phone). I've picked up this practice, praying before a call, text, or sending an email. My new goal is to acknowledge the Guardian Angel of each penitent as they enter the confessional. I've inserted words you can use to modify the prayer below. When you're praying to your Guardian Angel, hesitate not to pray for others through their Angels, too!


Angel of God,

Rule and guide.




