I remember, from my childhood, going to a professional baseball game with my dad and brother once or twice a year. From the time we would purchase the tickets, my brother and I would try to find out who would be on the starting line-up for the game. We were especially interested in studying the scheduled pitchers and learning their stats! That is a memory that has never left me. During my time in the seminary, I found myself interested in something else that seems quite like the 'starting lineup' of the ballgame. Each year as the middle of September approaches, I remember that we have lots of great liturgical celebrations that fall in a row: Sept 8 - The Nativity of Mary, Sept 12 - the Name of Mary, Sept 14 - the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and September 15 - Our Lady of Sorrows.

Is it not great that we have all these major feast days for us to look to for inspiration? I'd like to share two remarks about the liturgical calendar here. First of all, there is often an intrinsic connection to various feast days of Mary and feasts of our Lord. Notice that "The Nativity of Mary" forms an eight-day octave with the Feast of "Our Lady of Sorrows," the conclusion of which falls right on the heels of the "Exaltation of the Cross." This is to remind us that the entirety of the life of Faith, of which Mary is the supreme model, from her birth to the reception of her name, to her compassionate suffering with Jesus, is all united. The Church groups these major feasts together to remind us of their unity! Additionally, the grouping of these feasts together reminds me of the words of scripture, "Let no-one pull asunder what God hath joined together!" Mary and Jesus are closely united. In her conception and birth, she was prepared to be his mother. And when he died on the cross, she was there with Him in suffering. Now she stands with him in glory. Let us ask our Lord, through his blessed mother, that we might grow in our relationship to Him through her inseparable maternal intercession for us! -Fr. Armentrout
