In a meditation I gave recently, I repeated something I may have shared in a homily at the Cathedral or St. Mary's; my first recollection of a Christmas gift. You may remember something yourself. We lived in a ranch style home and the boys were in the basement and my parents and sisters were in the upstairs (main floor) bedrooms. I remember like yesterday, walking up the stairs and into the dining room attached to the living room, where there a basketball hoop was "peeking out" of the wrapping paper! I couldn't believe it!!! That basketball hoop got a lot of use over the years although my shot didn't necessarily improve.

Now, in these days, much greater emotion is experienced each year when I incense the manger where baby Jesus is laid! What a gift; the Father sent his only begotten son, through Mary and Joseph, into time, so we can enter into eternity some day! There is a custom in many places that, in the chapel or church, there is a baby Jesus that one can pick up and kiss (and wipe with a purificator/cloth) when you come or go during the Christmas Octave or Season. I don't see why you couldn't do that in your homes. Watch for that at the Cathedral and St. Mary's this year!!

Yes, the basketball hoop spurred me on to practice my shot in the driveway at the ranch home on Drexel Avenue in Racine, WI, but the manger and the life of Christ urges me on to want to be a saint. There are always rough edges to work on. Always things to talk to Jesus about. Always more people to love and serve. May Jesus be the best gift on our lists, and in His humanity may we connect to Him and believe He's calling us to follow Him more closely!


