Dear Cathedral and St. Mary's parishioners,

We are overjoyed to be present in the city of St. Joseph and to live our mission here. Thank you to all who have been part of this new beginning, whether helping to clean and prepare the rectory at St. Mary's, offering food, or saying hello after Mass. In all the preparations, encounters, and budding friendships, we have experienced God's love and care for us and have seen that He desires to come close to the people of St. Joseph.

So who are these little sisters in blue habits? "I've seen sisters in red, also in black, so is the blue something you work up to?" we were recently asked by a man who lives close to St. Mary's. No doubt he's seen various sisters who have served the Lord in this city! What a rich blessing it is for us to know that there is both a heritage and continued presence of religious in St. Joseph. Each community is like a different branch on the broad tree that is the Church. As little sisters of the Lamb, we are mendicants, meaning we are beggars, following in the footsteps of our patrons St. Dominic and St. Francis of Assisi.

"Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' ... Take no gold, nor silver, nor copper in your belts, no bag for your journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor a staff; for the laborer deserves his food" (Matthew 10:6-7, 9-10). We have the great privilege to live out literally these words from the Gospel in our everyday lives. Sent by Jesus and the Church as vulnerable lambs, we beg door-to-door for our daily bread amidst the poor so as to reveal who Jesus is – the Lamb of God, a fragile little baby born into poverty out of love for mankind. Through this simple mission we seek to reveal, especially to those on the peripheries of society, that Jesus freely offers His friendship and love to each person. It is beautiful to witness many people in St. Joseph opening their doors to us and their hearts to Jesus.

In November, three little sisters walked in the vicinity of St. Mary's and began to knock. A young mom came out on her porch and shook our hands. "It's nice to meet you," she said smiling. She was very happy to see us, it was almost as if she knew us! We thought to ourselves, "Maybe other little sisters have already begged here before!" We asked her if she could offer us some food for our lunch, and waving us inside her home, she prepared a grocery bag for us. "Wow! There's bread!" one of the little sisters exclaimed to the other. That morning, we prayed to receive some bread, and now God was so evidently providing for us. She was so surprised to hear our excitement that she said, "Wait! I can go get another loaf!"

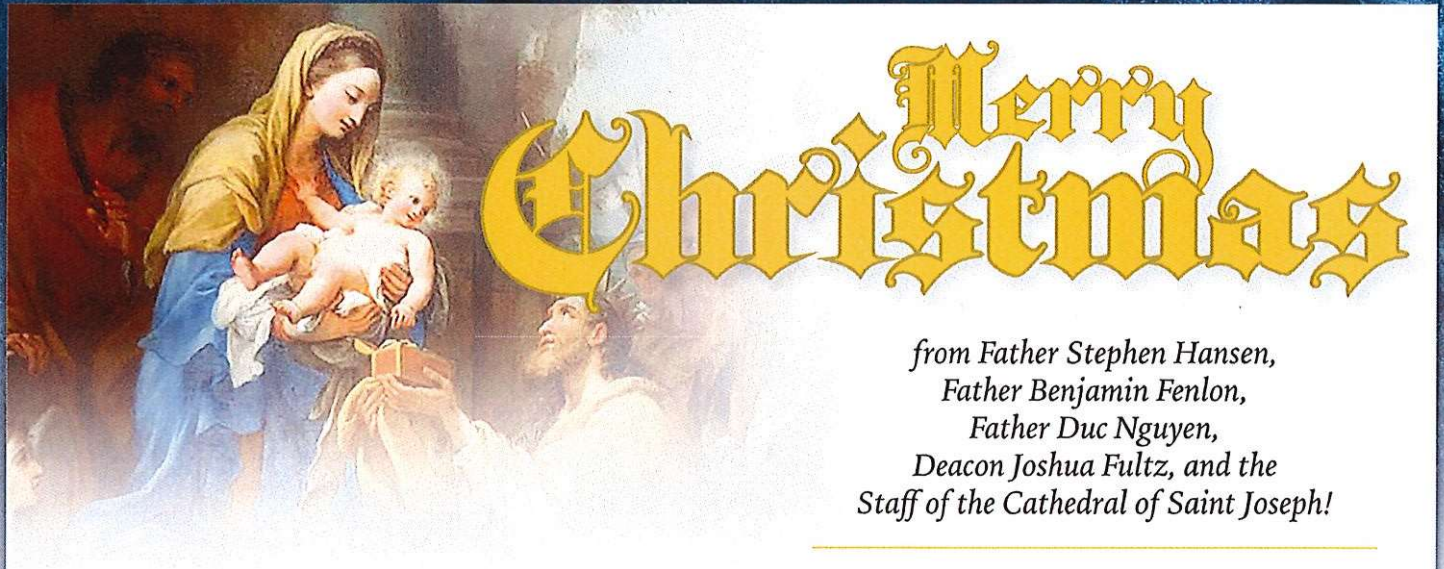
We were reminded of a homily Bishop James Johnston recently preached to us about our charism: "When anyone responds to someone who asks for something, it's an invitation to charity. And whenever a person chooses to give, to make an act of charity, they immediately become a **cooperator with the Father.**" She was for us a sign of God's fatherly presence, and we were the same for her, too. "I'm sorry," she said while drying her eyes, "that I'm getting emotional. It's just that right when you showed up, I was shopping for a Bible online because I want to get back to my faith. And then I opened my door, and there you were, sisters!" Although not Catholic, she loves that she can see St. Mary's from her house and told us, "When I look at the Church and its big dome, I feel safe." She came by our fraternity later that afternoon with more groceries and we all prayed together in the chapel. Part of our mission is also to intercede for those we meet, and this time it was particularly special to pray for her with Jesus present right there in the tabernacle.

Sometimes God allows us to see the fruit of the mission, as in this case, but other times it's not always evident. But no matter the response, we pray that by simply going out in this way, we can reflect the victorious light of Jesus the Lamb, He who became vulnerable and poor so as to draw each heart to Himself. This mission is also a contemplative one in which we are sent to encounter Jesus written on the faces of the people we meet, in their stories, sorrows, and joys.

Founded in France in 1981, we are an international community present in eight different countries with a male branch of little brothers. We have a little monastery, Lumen Christi, in downtown Kansas City, Kansas, where we began our first mission in the United States in 2008 at Archbishop Naumann's invitation. Three little sisters come to St. Joseph for about one week per month, which allows us to continue the mission in Kansas City. We hope that in the future the Community can send a group of little sisters to live consistently in St. Joseph. When we are in town, please come ring our doorbell! Our hearts are filled with thanksgiving as we witness the Lord at work in this new foundation! Thank you again for welcoming us, praying for us, and providing for us. May you be blessed during this Advent season as we joyfully await our Savior.
